### **Outcomes**

This workshop will introduce participants to a problem-solving framework for intervention planning that is grounded in health behavior change theory. The framework can be used to select evidence-based programs that match carefully considered performance, learning, and environmental change objectives, while also identifying areas suitable for new experimentation. Two case examples will illustrate how the framework can be used for program planning.

William DeJong, Ph.D. is a Professor in the Department of Social and Behavioral Sciences at the Boston University School of Public Health. Dr. DeJong served as director of the U.S. Department of Education’s Higher Education Center for Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse and Violence Prevention. He also served as Director of the Center for College Health and Safety (CCHS), based at Education Development Center, Inc. DeJong is the author of nearly 400 professional publications, many of which focus on issues related to alcohol and other drug (AOD) problems among college students.
